

Territorialis exhibition: La Rochelle, Gravelines and Villepreux rewarded for their anchoring to the SDGs

The 3_eedition of the Territorialis show, a flagship meeting for local authorities, was held in Bordeaux under the sign of the handover since Stéphane Pintre and Hélène Guillet, former and new president of the SNDGCT, were gathered to present the AFNOR trophies for territorial management. With Vincent Gillet, Deputy Secretary General of the Group, they welcomed the commitment of the general management of services to the SDGs.

Bordeaux – October 13, 2022–The AFNOR territorial management trophy ceremony was held at Territorialis, a major meeting of the DGS. The winning communities, rewarded following their evaluation in the AFNOR Public Performance Barometer, have provided proof of exemplary management of their territory aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

"Our societal commitments predate the SDGs and were made because we believe in our territory, because we know its demographics, its geography. But we can easily lose sight of these commitments when we are in daily life. The AFNOR barometer brings us back to reality. We then carry out all the transversal work accomplished",comments

"Our conviction is that the creation of territories requires partnerships. Our La Rochelle zero carbon territory project brings together 130 partners. Our social action is strong: it aims to involve all ages in civic life and in particular those intermediate ages where we are too young to vote, then later, older citizens who still want to get involved. The AFNOR barometer of public performance evaluates the concrete commitment of communities and EPCI on the 17 sustainable development objectives of the UN Agenda 2030, SDG by SDG, on the basis of the voluntary standard ISO 26000. Since its creation in 2018, it is tracking 250 communities, most of them meeting the SDGs without knowing it. This year, a trend stands out: SDG 3 – Health is generating strong mobilization, even though it is not a direct responsibility of the communities concerned: they are taking it on through other levers such as education. and sport... Conversely, the environmental SDGs receive less investment, in particular on issues of responsible consumption and production, the territorial food strategy and sustainable tourism, the reduction of greenhouse gases and the quality of the air.
